Student Absentees

Families are kindly asked to contact the school office before 9.30am if your child will be absent or late.

To notify us of a student being absent:

- Phone 8198 3100
- Select option 1 for absentee line
- Please leave the student's name, class and the reason for the student's absence.

If an absence is unexplained an automatic SMS message will be sent to parents requesting confirmation of an absence.

Late arrivals and early departures

All students who arrive at school after the 8.45am bell must sign in at the Front Office. Students who need to leave school before the 3.10pm dismissal time must be signed out in the Front Office by an adult.

Communication with the classroom teacher is required when a student:

- Is going to arrive at school late, due to a pre-arrangement
- Needs to leave before dismissal time
- Is going on a family holiday. For extended holiday's (7 days or more) an application for exemption from school must be completed and submitted to the Principal. Forms are available from the Front Office.
- Any other pre-arranged absence.

The school day

Any child on the school grounds who arrives earlier than 8:20am or is still on school grounds after 3:30pm will be placed in the Out of School Hours Care program and the parents billed accordingly.

School communications

Seesaw App - Student-Teacher-Parent Communications

Seesaw is an app which is used primarily for teachers to showcase what students are learning in the classroom. Their classroom teacher will use the app to post images, videos and information about students to their families.

Each student will have their own Seesaw portfolio profile which is set up by their classroom teacher. Families can download the app and follow the simple set up instructions to start following their child's portfolio. This information will be provided to parents at the beginning of the school year.

Audiri App – Whole school updates and information

The free Audiri school app (formally know as Skoolbag app) offers parents a convenient way to stay up-to-date with the school calendar, sign and submit school forms, read school newsletters, receive whole school updates and complete absentee forms. School newsletter

Every fortnight, our school publishes an online newsletter with key term dates, updates from our principal and assistant principal, updates from the classroom or from our extra-curricular activities. School communications

Class teacher email

Parents will be given the email address of their child's teacher and are encouraged to use this as the first point of communication regarding their child's learning and well-being. Our teachers will appropriately respond to emails in a timely manner.

Assessment and student feedback

Learning Conversations

An opportunity for teachers to share evidence on where each student is at and for parents to ask questions and receive feedback. These conversations will occur at the end of Term 1 and at the beginning of Term 3 after the mid year report. Parents are always welcome to make a meeting time outside these dates to discuss their child's progress.

Written Reports

Reports will go home at the end of Term 2 and Term 4. This will provide parents with assigned subject grades as well as an overall comment. Assigned A-E grades commence from Year 1.

3-way Conversations

These conversations happen prior to the commencement of Term 1. More information about these conversations are provided by the school closer to the time.

Student medications

If your child requires medication to be administered during the day then a parent must inform our front office staff and fill out the relevant forms.

Allergy aware School

Christ the King School is an allergy aware school. As an allergy aware school we endeavour to:

- Educate staff, students and families at Christ the King School about how certain products can cause an allergic reaction for some people.
- Build awareness about how students and families can ensure a safe environment at school for students with allergies.

In the interest of our students welfare we are seeking your support and cooperation with the following:

- Please do not send/bring in any nuts or nut products (eg. peanut butter or nutella) to school – please check labels.
- Remind your child NOT to share any food with any other students.
- Consult with your child's classroom teacher regarding appropriate birthday treats.
- When sending food for class parties it is desirable that the ingredients are labelled. Please do not send anything that may contain nuts for sharing.

If you have any queries regarding this matter, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.

School lunch boxes

We promote healthy eating at our school and encourage all parents to include items that are packaged in reusable containers to reduce landfill. Students should also be able to open their lunchboxes and containers independently. Please clearly label all containers, lunchboxes and drink bottles with your child's name and year level.

Crunch and Sip

At around 10am each day, students can snack on a piece of fruit or vegetables and some water before recess. We call this time Crunch and Sip. Younger students will often read a story during this time and older students may eat as they work.

Lunch Orders

Bayside Bakery provide the school with lunch orders every Wednesday. There is a large menu of lunch, snack and drink items. All lunch orders can be made through the QKR! app and orders must be placed by 9am on Wednesday morning. There are gluten free options available but the items are not guanteed to be Coeliac Safe.

School uniform

It is a condition of enrolment that all students wear the correct school uniform at all times when at school or when representing the school. For the first two weeks of Terms 2 and 4, students have the flexibility to wear either summer or winter uniforms, depending on the weather.

Masses and Prayer

Mass is celebrated in the Samaritan Hall on the first Friday of each month during school terms at 9:00am. Students and staff are involved in planning — reading, procession, singing and reflection.

Families and parishioners are invited to participate in masses and prayer services across the year. Families are welcome to gather after the service for coffee and a catch up.

Prayer at Christ the King extends beyond mass. Prayer takes place within classrooms, staff room, assemblies and camp. More formal Prayer Services take place at certain times of the year e.g. Holy Week, Lent, Harmony Day, Book Week, End of Year Graduation, Grandfriends Day, Advent.

School payments

Tuition and Fees

CTK offers a two-tier fee structure to enable equity within its fee billing. The tuition fee includes all tuition, stationery, IT and support, including use of iPads and laptops.

Term 3 Reception intake fees are NIL for Terms 3 & 4 if your child is completing 6 terms of Reception.

Costs not covered include:

- Uniforms
- After School Sports
- Private Music Tuition
- Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)

School fees are invoiced in full at the beginning of each school year, with statements posted out by the end of Week 2, Term 1. Subsequent statements are issued at the beginning of each term thereafter.

Payement

The preferred method of payment is via a Payment Plan through direct debit or credit card. Other options include BPay or EFT.

Information about fee schedules and tuition discounts are available through our website or school front office.

QKR! App

Our school uses the QKR! App to process simple payments for various school-based events or activities.
