## From our Principal

Dear Parents,

What a wonderful term this has been and the many highlights that I am privileged to see. I am able to see the extraordinary in the ordinary moments of the life of a school. At Christ the King School, every day brings a new experience which is part of our 'rich normality' that offers opportunities for children to engage in a variety of 'Ways of Knowing, Being, and Doing'. In this way we provide a landscape for children to flourish and to grow at Christ the King School.

### Multicultural Day

Our multicultural day was a huge success and we can draw a sense of pride from our small school community in which every child is known by name and all staff are able to know and understand each child. We engaged the students in an interactive day across the school with every child experiencing art, craft dance, history, geography and culture of different countries. The staff, including our ESO staff, outdid themselves with providing a variety of activities throughout the whole day and rotated groups of children. Our students had a passport and visited different areas of the school dedicated to a specific country and activity. They had their passports stamped for China, Korea, Spain, Russia, Malaysia, Nepal, Ireland, Australia, India and Africa. Russian Cossack dancing and Irish Dancing were very popular, and our cultural diversity was celebrated. We had our own children demonstrate Nepalese dancing which was wonderful. The day provided opportunities for all our children to shine and share their families culture and their many talents in a myriad of ways.

We also had some wonderful parent volunteers who came into the school and spoke to the children about their Nepalese culture. I would like to thank Krishana Gautam and Binita Gautam Joshi who volunteered their time for this and were so engaging and informative.

Days like this provide an enriching experience for all our children and apart from the rich academic learning, they also learn to work with different age groups, different adults and use their inquiry, creative, problem solving and thinking skills which contribute to life-long learning.

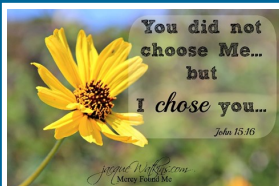

## ACER/PAT testing

Each year students in Year 1-6 complete two online tests in the areas of Reading/Comprehension and Mathematics (PAT R and PAT M). These tests give teachers important information on student progress from year to year and also their areas of strength and growth. It is a valuable assessment tool that informs a teacher's planning and units of work. We will complete these tests across week 8 and 9 this term with each test taking approximately 45min. # Wellbeing

The shifting dynamics of these unprecedented times continue to highlight that your child's relationships, identity, belonging, and learning are essential to their happiness and success at school.

This week 24th—28th August every student in a Catholic School in South Australia will participate in a simple online Classroom Pulse Check In. This Check In has been developed to ascertain how students are currently feeling about their experience in school. It is tailored to allow your child's teacher(s) to check in and provide immediate feedback and support to them. The Check In will be carried out during the school day.

I am conscious that life in school has its' ups and downs, but I am also confident that your child's teachers want to understand how they are feeling so they are able to support you and your child in meeting any social, emotional, or learning needs that they may have.

To enable this, your child's teacher and I will have access to their responses to facilitate follow up and support as required. Please be assured, as your child's prime caregiver that any support required will be communicated and discussed with you in advance.

As you can see below, there are a range of simple questions about your child's life at school, their identity as a person and a learner, their sense of belonging, safety, and friendships.

For each statement, students will select whether they feel it applies to them “most of the time,” “sometimes” or “not very often.” Students in Reception – Year 3 will have emojis alongside the options to help them identify their feelings.

In addition to supporting your child, de-identified data from all participating schools will be used by Catholic Education SA to identify trends to assist in future planning for the support of the learning and wellbeing for students across South Australia.

We believe this Check In will play an important part in supporting that goal and your child.

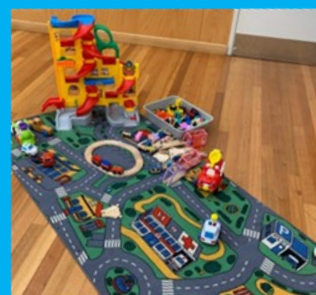




