Fee Reduction

Following the initiative from CESA, the School Board have agreed to a reduction in school fees for every child for 2021.

Reducing our school fees for all families is a part of the Catholic Education Strategy to make Catholic Education more affordable.

We will publish our full reduced fee schedule by the end of this Term – this will include sibling discount and process for low-income families. At Christ the King School it is our aim to be able to work closely with families to ensure every child has access to a quality Catholic education. Further information will be on our Website.

Term 4 Starting Dates

<u>Next term, we begin on Wednesday October 14th</u>. The staff will be involved in a Professional Learning Day and a Whole Staff Reflection Day. The first two days of Term 4 will be Pupil Free Days: Monday 12th & Tuesday 13th of October.

Class Placements

The process of class placements for 2021 is about to commence. Please return the notices that were issued last week about your intentions for 2021. Each year teachers spend a great deal of time looking at class placements for the following year. This process takes many things into account. We take into consideration the learning needs of all students. We aim to ensure classes are 'balanced', by also taking into consideration a balance of gender, progress and levels of children's learning, the specific needs (social/emotional, learning and physical) of all children and relationships.

At this time of the year, we have not finalised staffing and class structures. Requests for specific teachers are not a part of our process. If there is an urgent consideration that you feel we need to be made aware of, please email me before **the end Week 1 next term** (hcard@christking.catholic.edu.au).

Being a part of the CTK School learning community gives children an opportunity to meet and learn with many different children and adults. We encourage children's resilience in expanding friendships and developing skills to work and learn with a variety of different people. This is an important aspect of life-long learning and resilience.

CTK Disco

Last Friday night's Disco was once again a brilliant school community event, and the children had a fantastic time dancing the night away. A huge acknowledgement and many thanks to all of the parent volunteers for their great organisation and management of the event without their organization and involvement the event would not have been so successful. COVID has meant that school events this year have had to be postponed, and it was lovely to host a community event again.

Tools for Building Resilience

There are some systematic rules that the research is designed around to use in everyday life for parents and educators to share in their discussions when supporting children to face everyday encounters and situations. These tools help our students build resilience, self-mastery, kindness, and empathy and is based on a Social Emotional Programme in the United States.

The Quiet/Safe Place Tool – a good tool for anyone to use when they need a break

The Listening Tool – remember to listen with your ears, your eyes, and your heart

The Empathy Tool – I care for myself and for others.

The Personal Space Tool – each of us has a right to their own space

Using Our Words Tool – very helpful when siblings are using their bodies to resolve conflicts

Garbage Can Tool – I can let the little things go.

Taking Time Tool – sometimes we just need some time away to calm down or think about problems

Please and Thank You Tool – remember to treat others with kindness and respect

Apology and Forgiveness Tool – I admit my mistakes and work to forgive yours.

Patience Tool – We are all strong enough to wait

Courage Tool – I have the courage to do the "right" thing.

As we head into Term 4, students will change into their summer uniforms and bringing and wearing a hat at school is essential. I take this opportunity to thank you all for your ongoing support at CTK and for allowing us to learn alongside your children. Have a wonderful break.

Currently we are celebrating the Season of Creation Pope Francis states that the Season of Creation is a "season of increased prayer and effort on behalf of our common home." In the past few weeks several of our classes have discovered some of the wonders of creation by going out into the world. The Year 5 class went on a Zoo Snooze. They were able to spend two days and a night at the Zoo talking with keepers and education officers about the care of the animals, their feeding routines and sleeping habits. One of the highlights was 'having the Zoo to themselves'. The class were able to take a night time and dawn walk around the Zoo exploring the lives of nocturnal and crepuscular creatures. They discovered and learnt a great deal about God's wonderful creation and returned back to school with a renewed vigour to help sustain it.

The Reception/Year1 and Year2 classes continued the theme of exploration of God's wonder with an excursion to Warrawong Wildlife Sanctuary. The highlight was seeing native animals in their own habitat. They were fortunate to hold snakes, have birds rest on their arms and see gliders, wallabies and emus up close. The staff took this wonder back into the classroom with prayers, art and writing.



MACQLIT PROGRAM

Our MacqLit program has come to an end this year and we are very proud of the efforts displayed by all the participating students. The program will continue next year, and we will also be introducing MiniLit for students in Year 1 and Year 2. Like MacqLit, MiniLit is an early literacy intervention program which aims at improving five literacy skills of (1) Phonemic Awareness, (2) Phonics, (3) Fluency, (4) Vocabulary and (5) Comprehension, particularly the first three. Both programs will be run from Term 1 in 2021.

Jesus will always welcome you back as a friend.


We are asked to be the face of God.
