This weekend many around the world will stop to attend Easter services. In our school this week we have commemorated these events through re-enactments, class learning tasks and sharing of the story, to name a few.

One of the biggest discussions centred around easter eggs and the connection between eggs and Jesus. NAPLAN practice test

Last week the Year 3 students participated in the online NAPLAN practice test. This test is run to test the platform's technical capabilities and to also allow students to experience what the test looks like. Students were exposed to many different question types including Maths and Comprehension and had the chance to answer a variety of question styles including multiple choice and ordering of facts. The year 5 students will also have the opportunity to complete the practice test next week and are already working on their typing skills ready for the online writing section.
