From our Principal

Dear Families,

What a term so far, in each of the classrooms there has been so much happening and we are still only just halfway through the term.

- Reception and Year 1: A new Literacy approach being implemented called Heggerty. This involves daily, explicit and systematic phonological and phonemic awareness.
- Year 2 and 3: the classes are participating in a 5 week Cultural Residency Project and are engaging with an Indigenous Consultant.
- Year 4 and 5 have joyously prepared for the Dream Big Children's Festival and performed together with 1200 students at the Festival Centre.
- Year 6 students have been great leaders in our school and great buddies to our younger students. They attended a wonderful camp this term which will inform their learning about our local South Australian History.
- Great learning across the school in Digitech and Resource Based Learning.
- In Japanese, we celebrated Children's Day and the students made 'kanobori' fish streamers to fly for the special day.
- Lacrosse Coaching Clinic has been running for the last few weeks. This six week coaching clinic is run by Sporting Schools Programme and involves our Years 3-6.

As a whole school we have committed 20 minutes each day to explicitly teach the Base 10 rules in Numeracy and we are currently working with a Maths consultant to continue to improve our student outcomes in Numeracy.

This is just a snapshot of the varied opportunities and activities. There is so much more and CTK is a happening and dynamic place of learning!!

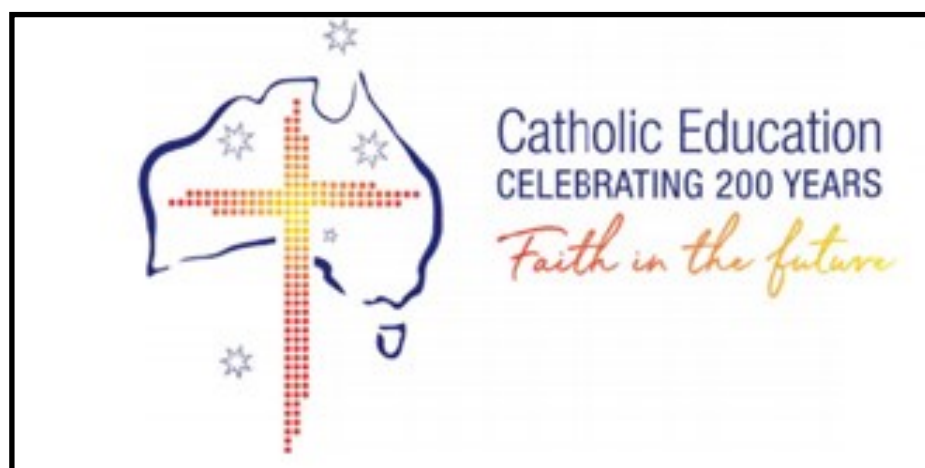

Faith in the future

This year we are celebrating 200 Years of Catholic Education in Australia. A national theme was devised, “Faith in the future” for the celebrations. The theme reflects the core purpose of Catholic education to form students in their faith, and to provide an education that enables our graduates to make a meaningful contribution to the world. The theme reflects our commitment to build on the great work of those who have come before us, and to provide a Catholic education for future generations of students in a world that is rapidly changing and poses new challenges for Catholic school communities. Yet, we have faith that we can face these challenges and continue to build on and strengthen our mission of Catholic education.

From humble beginnings almost 200 years ago, Australia’s 1,746 Catholic schools now educate over 764,000 children. This is one in five Australian students.

Catholic Schools in Australia are flourishing, as a direct result of the dedication of passionate priests, religious and lay people who have worked tirelessly to educate students and nurture faith. These efforts rely heavily on the support of staff, families, and students.

The Christian cross is the central element of the logo and represents the faith dimension of Catholic schools and our mission of service in Christ. The Southern Cross and outline of Australia represents the Great South Land of Australia. Dots are used as a key design element connecting to the traditional custodians of the land – the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The colours – burnt red and yellow – represent the desert in the heart of the Australian outback, contrasting with the deep blue representing the Southern sky and ocean surrounding our continent.

I loved it when the teachers were being so competitive in Family Feud.

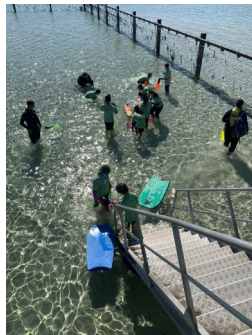
