From the APRIM

This week has been a flurry of activity at school as it is in most schools during the last week of term. The end of Term 1 in catholic schools bring with it extra significance and activity, for we commemorate Holy Week. It is the week Christians remember the last week of Jesus' life.

Our classes commemorated this week through a series of activity stations spread across the days and school locations. In many households students will come home recounting their experiences.



Palm Sunday

This is the Sunday before **Easter Sunday**. It is the first day of Holy Week and celebrates Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem riding on a donkey. His followers believed he was the foretold king come to release them from Roman rule.

Anglican and Roman Catholic churches bless palm leaves, as a reminder of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. People often make them into crosses and keep for the year. In the Front Office we have some extra palms blessed this week for families to take and share.

Holy Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday

During these days Jesus travelled into and out of Jerusalem sharing meals with friends, preaching and trying desperately to get the apostles to understand his fate. During this time Jesus shared the parable of the 'Mustard Seed', Jesus was anointed with oils and, enraged cleared the temple of the moneychangers.

Holy Thursday

This is the Thursday before Easter Day. Christians remember when Jesus shared the Jewish commemoration of the **Passover**. Jesus' action known as the Last Supper are the actions of the priest in mass.

Following the Last Supper Christians recall Jesus' plea to his father to be released from his fate while praying in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus' subsequent arrest and trial takes place through the night and leads to the long walk through Jerusalem to his crucifixion.

Good Friday

Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday when Christians remember Jesus' crucifixion. During the 2 major Good Friday services, Christians reflect on the meaning of the crucifixion and the central message of Christianity. This message is, that through his death on the cross, Jesus atoned for the sin of humanity.

The 2 services on Good Friday are Stations of the Cross (Brighton Parish at 10am) and Liturgy at 3 pm. Good Friday is the only day that a full mass is not offered. The service at 3pm usually includes readings, veneration of the Cross and distribution of communion. 3pm is chosen for prayer as it is the most solemn time in all of Christianity as it is thought to be the time Jesus died.

Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday marks Jesus' resurrection. The gospels record that after Jesus was crucified, his body was taken down from the cross, and placed in a cave. The cave was guarded by Roman soldiers and an enormous stone was put over the entrance, so that no one could steal the body.

On Sunday, three days after the crucifixion, Mary Magdalene followed by some of Jesus' disciples visited the tomb to find that the stone had been moved and Jesus' body had gone. Jesus appeared to women in each gospel account in different forms and continued to join the apostles and disciples in the coming days.

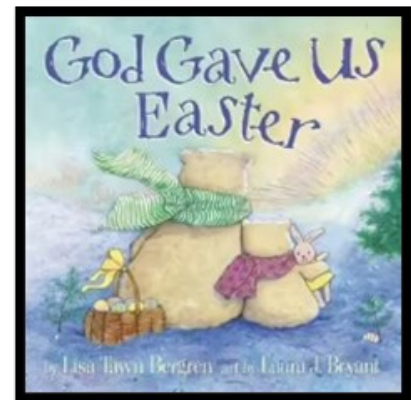
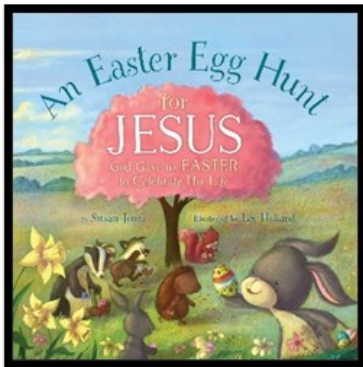

Curriculum Corner

Reading in the Holidays

As we head into the holidays for a well deserved break it is important to remember that students need to continue to read. This might include reading their readers, sharing a picture book, reading with mum or dad, talking about a book or using a book to make up your own stories. These reading experiences support so many areas of a child's learning including oral language, vocabulary knowledge and reading skills. Below are some great prompts that can be used when a child is reading out loud at home. These strategy bookmarks have been put together by SPELD NSW to support students and their parents.

SUPPORTING WORD READING SUCCESS

Use these tips to support a reader stuck on a word



READ LEFT TO RIGHT

Direct the reader to work from left to right when reading

LOOK AT THE LETTERS

Paying attention to the letters and the structure of the word is important. Prompting readers to look at the word teaching them to focus on the word rather than guessing using pictures.



SOUND OUT THE WORD

Encourage the reader to point to the letters and sound out the word. Tracking with a finger helps focus the reader.

BLEND THE SOUNDS TOGETHER

Blending the sounds to form a word is an important step in becoming a fluent reader. After sounding out always encourage blending to form a whole word.



SAY THE WORD OUT LOUD

When learning to read, saying the words out loud helps the reader hear the words and then think about their meaning.

TALK ABOUT THE MEANING

If the reader doesn't recognise the word, tell them the meaning or use the context to discuss the new vocabulary.

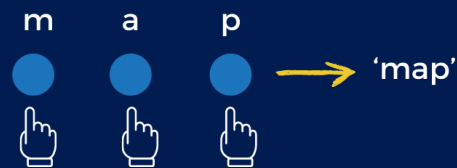

Curriculum Corner

Reading Strategies

WORD ATTACK TIPS

Use these tips to support a reader to attack new words



MORPHEMES

Many words have meaningful parts called morphemes (e.g. suffixes, prefixes and base words). Analyse those first:
unwanted- un + want + ed
prediction- pre + dict + ion

SYLLABLES CAN HELP

English spelling is not syllabic but sometimes helping a reader break down larger words into smaller syllables can help:
fan/tas/tic
won/der/ful



SOUND OUT THE WORD

Encourage the reader to point to the letters and sound out the word. Tracking with a finger helps focus the reader:
s-l-i-p = slip
l-ea-sh = leash

BLEND THE SOUNDS TOGETHER

Teach the reader blending strategies to deal with new words:
Additive blending: s... sa... sat/ r... rai... rain
Continuous Phonation = sssaaaaat = sat / rrrrainnnnn = rain



SAY THE WORD OUT LOUD

When learning to read, saying the words out loud helps the reader hear the words and then think about their meaning.
"Have I heard this word before?"

WRITE IT OUT

Practising spelling the word can help encode that word to long term memory for automatic recall when reading.



SPELDNSW

If a reader is stuck- ask them to use taught word attack skills.

Still stuck?
Jump in and model the strategies for them- avoid guessing!

Select your Country of Residence as 'Australia' and follow the steps to register

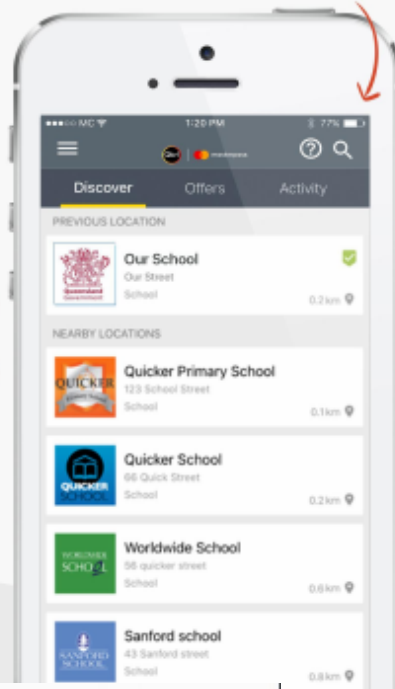
Step 3 Find our school

We value parents and friends involvement wherever possible. The knowledge, skills, dedication and time that you share with us as a volunteer is greatly appreciated.

WHAT I NEED TO VOLUNTEER

COVID-19 Vaccination

If you wish to volunteer or continue to volunteer in 2022 the Government has mandated that all volunteers need to ensure prior to volunteering their time that they are fully vaccinated with both does of COVID-19 vaccination or be medically exempt.

What do I need to supply as evidence and who do I give it to?

The school will need a copy of your verified vaccination status or medical exemption. This can be a hard copy dropped into the Front Office or emailed to info@christking.catholic.edu.au.

It will be stored confidentially and securely.

What if I will not or cannot comply with Government direction on COVID vaccination?

If you choose not to comply with this direction, unfortunately you will not be able to volunteer your time for any purpose at Christ the King School. You can of course, drop off and pick up your child/ren from school.

The following are also required to be completed prior to commencing any volunteer duties:

Police Clearance: Front office to sight original.

Acceptable forms of clearance:

- Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide—Police Check Unit. Letter or card to be presented.
- SA Police Officer—SAPOL Badge to be presented.
- Australian Federal Police—AFP Badge to be presented
- Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- All children under 14 years of age are exempt.

CTK supports the payment of Working with Children Checks for volunteers which can be applied for by following the link: <https://screening.sa.gov.au/application-information-for-individuals>. Screening and verification checks last 5 yrs.
